Special Exhibition on Lebensborn e.V. at Topography of Terror



Marking the 73rd anniversary of the founding of Lebensborn eV on Friday, Dec 12, 2008, the undercover group Rainbow Rebels, rumored to be linked with the Nomadic Quilombo network vandalized the current exhibition at the former Nazi headquarters on Niederkirchnerstrasse 8, Berlin-Mitte.

In statements left around the scene where the Third Reich's policy for selective breeding was born, the Rainbow Rebels likened society's current development in child-bearing techniques to the ideology behind Heinrich Himmler's program to propagate the Aryan race.

The Lebensborn e.V. (was founded on December 12, 1935, in part as a response to declining birth rates in Germany, in order to promote the policies of Nazi eugenics. The purpose of the programme was to provide incentives to encourage Germans, especially SS members, to have more children.

"Today 73 years later the core of the Lebensborn philosophy is still alive in the hundreds of Western couples who are turning towards science and technology to harvest their own babies. 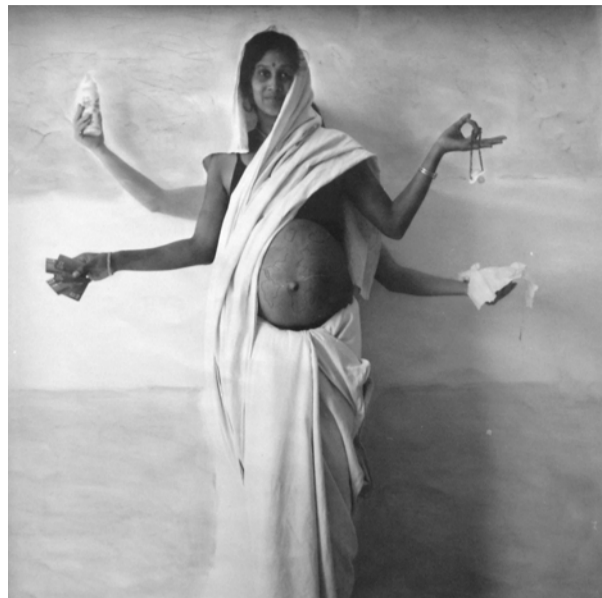


one too many mouths to feed and would probably have to give away or drown the next child that she would definitely bear within the next year.
